### **School Shop**

The shop is open to KS1 and KS2 but not reception. For those of you sending money in with your children to spend at the shop, please can you ensure the cash sent is in small denominations.

### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Please ensure your child/ren attends school every day, unless they are too poorly to do so. If your child is not able to attend, please ensure that you **call** the school office before 09:15 to advise. If you are calling before school opens, please leave a message as directed on the answer phone.

### Punctuality is equally important:

Arriving 5 minutes **late** every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year = 20 lessons **missed**. Arriving 15 **minutes late** every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year = 55 lessons **missed**. Arriving 25 **minutes late** every adds up to 19 days absence a year = 123 lessons **missed** 

### **Fixed Penalty Notices for Unauthorised Holidays**

Can we remind you of the new regulations that came in to effect on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024, that to ensure we apply the law consistently and fairly in line with all Cheshire West and Chester schools that the FPN system is now in place.

Should an unauthorised leave of absence be of a duration of 10 consecutive school sessions (i.e. five school days) or more, on the request of the Head Teacher or School's Governing Body, the local authority will issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) to each of the child's the parents/carers.

Should you still choose to take this leave of absence with your child during this period the Local Authority will be informed as this will constitute an unauthorised absence. A Fixed Penalty Notice will then be issued in accordance with section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

### Penalties for unauthorised absence

The law stipulates that the current penalties payable by parents are £160 if paid within 28 days reducing to £80 if paid within 21 days per parent/carer per child.

The National Framework for penalty notices introduces a new national limit of 2 penalty notices that can now be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period. If a second Fixed Penalty Notice is issued to the same parent for the same child, within three years of a first Fixed Penalty Notice, the second Fixed Penalty Notice is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.

Once two Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued, if a 3<sup>rd</sup> unauthorised leave of absence occurs within a 3-year period, the Local Authority is able to move to prosecution immediately. If the fixed penalty is not paid this could lead to you being prosecuted in the Magistrates' Court.

### Parking/Driving on to site

With the increased number of parents driving on to site to collect children, it is getting extremely busy at drop off and pick up times. Please may we request that you drive onto site if absolutely necessary and only if you have a Blue Badge (unless otherwise agreed). If your blue badge has expired and you have not updated school, you will be removed from the list

For those of you who have junior aged children, please can we encourage you to ask them to walk and meet you off site if they are able to.

For morning drop off, cars may drive on to site after 8.30am and for pick up, after 3.00pm.



### Messages

Messages for pupils are only to be given in an emergency. If you need to leave a message for your child before the end of the day, please make contact before 3pm, as the staff in the school can't always leave the office when it is busy with children and parents.

Additionally, if you are going to be late collecting your child, please can you call the school and let us know.

Please note we will no longer be accepting cash if it isn't in a sealed envelope with your child's name clearly written on it.

Kindly note that slots for parents evening are bookable only on School Spider. The slots will be available from **6pm on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October** and will close on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October at 9am. Appointments are available on a first come, first served basis.

Please do not try to book before 6pm on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October as the system will not allow this.

Reminder: payment for toast can also now be made on line, at a cost of £1.25 per week. Toast is only made available for Junior children therefore please do not make payment for any child who is not in Year 3 and above. Please may we remind all parents/carers that toast money is only sent in on Mondays. We will no longer be accepting payments for toast after Mondays. Any monies received for toast from Tuesday to Friday will be allocated to the following week's toast account. Both toast and dinner money are payable in advance.
